The Pit is a pulse-pounding thriller about survival, a mother's unbreakable love, and the courage to fight for what matters most.







RON PERLMAN - ATTACHED

CASTING DIRECTOR




CARLA HOOL

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT



"I've been through it all, Baby, I am mother courage." -Elizabeth Taylor

Bertolt Brecht has inspired my storytelling. His "Mother Courage" inspires me to imbue Penny Diaz (the mother in "The Pit") with real courage, unlike Anna Fierling, who sacrificed it to save her business and life. Mother's struggles and protective instincts are common in popular culture. It's fascinating how themes from Greek theatre transcend time and place. "The Pit" is no exception. Its relevance, language, and dramatic connections are rooted in contemporary life. More a thriller than a horror film, "The Pit" avoids supernatural elements or human stupidity to place characters in jeopardy. Instead, it presents a brutally real social experience that could happen to anyone. Therefore, "The Pit" must feel as real as possible, with genuine settings, dialogues, and reactions.

There is no enhanced reality; everything is elevated. Characters don't lie; they deceive. Nothing is random; everything is logical, making the outcomes more terrifying. Survival instincts, skills, and courage help characters overcome the extreme situations the script tests them with, ultimately highlighting their love as warriors and mothers.

The tone, visuals, and style must be precise. The camera must be an active participant, capturing fear, desperation, and strategy in the actors' faces and words. Performance is crucial—close-ups, eye movements, and intonation are as important as choreographed shots. Staging, action, and stunts must be raw and believable, without concessions. The pit's height should be insurmountable, even for an experienced climber. Fights must consider the performers' physical characteristics, fear, adrenaline, and skill levels to maintain realism. Any fake move or illogical maneuver will jeopardize the story. Precision is our defining word. With a perfect structure, dramatic arc, intense hero's journey, and crucial moral lesson, "The Pit" will be a highly satisfying film experience worldwide.




THE MOTHER Penelope "Penny" Diaz

A mother and cancer survivor. Penny pushed everything aside to beat the disease, including her husband and daughter. She knew there would be a cost, but she hoped to rebuild those breaks when she got better. Penny's own mother died of cancer when she was young, she won't let the same happen to her own daughter, Maya.

With her cancer in remission, Penny become a cross-fit fanatic, using fitness to stay ahead of any potential illness or relapse. At the same time, she tries to reconnect with her teenage daughter, hoping she hasn't pushed her too far away. But as much as she tries, there is a wall between the two. Maya sees her Mom's devotion to her 'cancer friends', fellow survivors, replacing her.

Penny drags Maya to her competitions in the hopes that maybe Maya will see why they're so important to her, but to no avail. It seems that even though Penny 'won' her battle against cancer, she's 'lost' her daughter. She can't convince Maya that she cares about her more than anything in the world, that is until they are kidnapped. It's then that Maya will realize that a mother's love is more powerful, stronger, and everlasting than any force on earth.



THE MASTER Frank Simon

A master serial killer. He's been working his horrific ways for some time. From his sprayed-on tan to steroid-produced muscles, it seems Frank is trying to project a youthful presence, keeping up a 'lady's man' swagger. In many ways, he's like Penny, but the disease he's battling isn't cancer, but growing old. Each weight he pumps, teeth-whitener he uses, and every woman he kills makes him feel younger.

With Greg under his spell, he has a willing accomplice to his murders. But do Frank and Greg harbor an even deeper dark secret than being serial killers?



THE APPRENTICE Greg

A young man with a disarming charm, but there's a darkness lurking beneath the surface. Under the influence of a deranged mentor, he is learning the craft of kidnap and murder.

When he and PENNY are trapped in the pit, an uneasy truce is formed as they must work together to escape. He claims they face a greater evil, but can he be trusted? Is he a victim seeking salvation, or a cunning predator playing mind games?



THE DAUGHTER Maya Diaz

Like any teenage daughter, her relationship with her mother is complex but it's even more strained by Maya's feelings of abandonment. She's felt the brunt of Penny's sometimes caustic attitude when her Mom was fighting cancer.

Maya has seen her mom miss important school events to go to cancer survivor meetings or cross-fit events, seemingly always putting Maya at the bottom of the list of things that are important. Maya responds to her perceived lack of love from her mother by being a cold-detached daughter, even though she craves her mother's attention and love.

When Maya's kidnapped by a pair of serial killers her life will depend on the one person she thinks doesn't care; her mom.









MOSES FLORES Producer

Moses Flores began his career in production in Austin, Texas, on television shows such as AMC's acclaimed spinoff series Fear The Walking Dead and Amazon Prime's Panic. He subsequently moved to Los Angeles to produce fashion editorials for clients such as Condé Nast, GQ, and Interview Magazine. He later ventured into Acquisitions and Development at Plus Entertainment before founding Cabiria Pictures, a film development and production company, in 2023. He currently spearheads financing and production for feature films in the \$5 -15 MM range for U.S. domestic and international LatAm audiences.
